Junior superheroes

In school we are learning about how to write fuller descriptions of the characters in our stories, just like in books. This activity is to help your child go beyond the appearance of their invented character. Your child can write in notes, not full sentences for this activity. It is the ideas that really matter!

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1. You're going to invent a brand new Superhero for a film to be made in Hollywood, but this Superhero is going to be a child the same age as you!
2. Talk to your helper about your superhero.
3. Is it a boy or girl?
4. What is their super power? Are they like an animal, like Spiderman? Do they have a super human talent – like running fast or turning things to ice?
5. Draw a picture of your superhero, showing what their superpower is.
