## PURPOSE

The Academy of Woodlands aims to provide a high quality service which meets the needs of both Parents/Carers and children. For Parents/Carers, this means knowing that your child is safe and happy in a club that is reliable and offers a consistent service. For a child, this means an environment that is safe, supportive, encouraging, nurturing, a place to be with friends and make new ones, to relax, to have fun and enjoy.

We provide a free breakfast club so that the opportunity is offered for any of our children to access a nutritional breakfast before school starts. It is a provision extended beyond just our children; Parents/Carers and siblings are actively encouraged to attend our free Breakfast Club, bringing our community together.

We encourage our pupils to be independent by serving themselves and sitting with their family/carers, to enjoy breakfast together. After our pupils have eaten breakfast, there are a selection of games for the pupils to play with their friends and family - again encouraging social interaction amongst pupils and parents/carers.

### OFFER

- Open Monday to Friday between 8am and 8.40am
- Entrance via the Arts Centre from 8am
- Free Breakfast Club held in the school dining hall

Breakfast on offer can include (dependent on availability):

- A range of cereals with/without milk
- Toast/Crumpet/Bagel
- Fruit (children only)
- Milk and water
- Tea and coffee (Parents/Carers only)

# WHO CAN ACCESS FREE BREAKFAST CLUB?

- Pupils in Year 1 to Year 6 can access the free breakfast club independently.
- Nursery and Reception children can also access the free breakfast club when they are **accompanied and supervised by their Parents/Carers**.

- Staff of Academy of Woodlands
- Parents/Carers and siblings of children who attend the Academy of Woodlands

# AGREEMENT

- Please ensure your child is supervised whilst waiting for Breakfast Club; if a child is found unattended, on school grounds, before 8am, they will be taken to Wasps and you will be charged a fee
- Children must register with a member of staff located in the Arts Centre; they must not enter before being registered. They will be escorted to the dining hall by a member of staff
- The School behaviour policy applies at free Breakfast Club; if a child does not follow the behaviour expectations during free breakfast club, they will not be able to attend
- Children collected by the school minibus will attend free Breakfast Club when they arrive at school, they will be supervised by the minibus team
- Children will go straight from free Breakfast Cub to their classrooms; younger children will be escorted by staff
