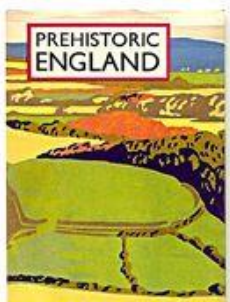


Homework Grid - Year 3 Autumn Term 1- Stone Age to Iron Age

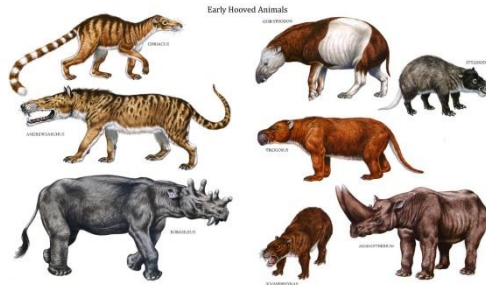
Choose one of the six homework ideas below to do as your Topic homework for this term. The following websites have lots of information about Stone Age to Iron Age:
