

What to do...

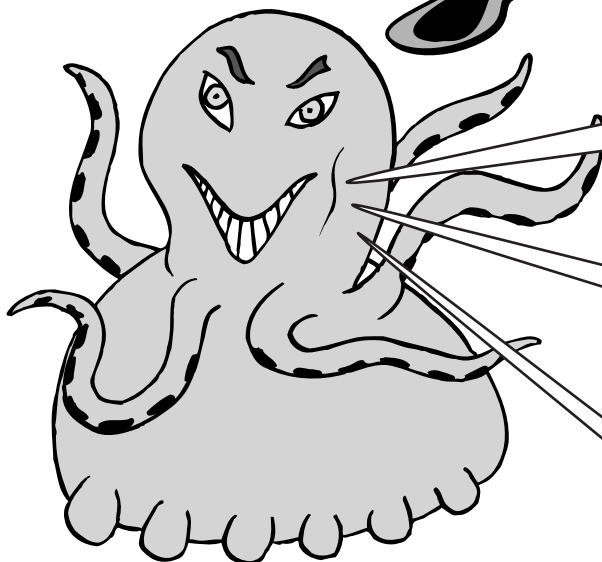
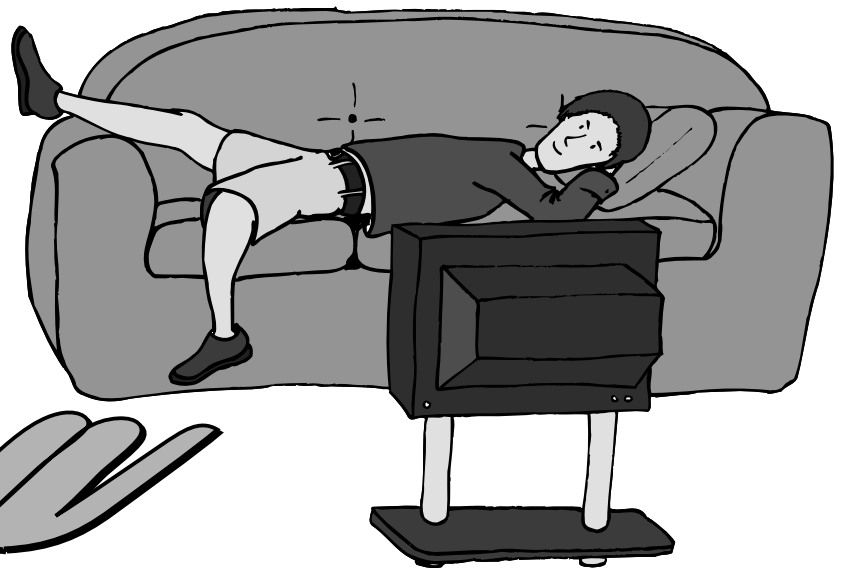


That's not fair!

Instructions should use commands or bossy language and be direct and clear. This activity uses the home setting so that it is familiar to the child and a topic of regular interest in many homes!

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1. Everyone has to live by the rules, even adults!
2. What rules are there in your house that you think are fair?
3. What rules do you think are not fair?
4. Write down three rules that you think are fair.
5. Write them like instructions, using bossy language, for example 'Always take your shoes off in the house'.
6. Write down three rules that you think are NOT fair, again writing them like instructions (e.g. Finish your dinner before you get any pudding.)
7. Which rule would you most like to change?
8. Write a sentence at the end of your instructions, saying which you would most like to change and why.
