

 Homework will be set on a Tuesday and needs to come back to school the following Monday.

Homework

- Children will have their spelling test on a Friday.
- Homework will consist of a piece of Maths and English related to what has been, or what will be, covered in class.
- There is also a topic based piece of homework for children to undertake.
 Children will be given the choice of six different tasks. They choose one of those and complete the task, bringing in their homework at the end of term.

- MTC stands for Multiplication Tables Check.
- This is a national test which all children in Year 4, throughout the country, will sit in June.
- It will be taken on a computer.
- It will focus on their recall of their times tables only and not division.
- Children have 25 questions and 6 seconds to answer each one.

- Now your child is in their second year of being in the juniors, we will have a stronger focus on reading comprehension.
- Children still need to read as much as they can at home.
- Please sign their contact book each time you read with them. Putting which pages they have read and whether they have finished their book is particularly helpful.
- There is no need to read a whole book every night. In fact it is probably more useful to just read a few pages and spend time discussing what has been read and asking questions to check for understanding.

Reading



- Your child will have already brought home a login for the Purple Mash website. This is the site the whole school will be using to support the children's ICT lessons.
- There are a couple of multiplication games on this site which would be really useful practise for the MTC, as well as lots of other games and activities which will support the children's learning in different areas.
- Teachers will set tasks for the children to complete at home and whilst these are not compulsory, they will be supporting your child's work in class.
