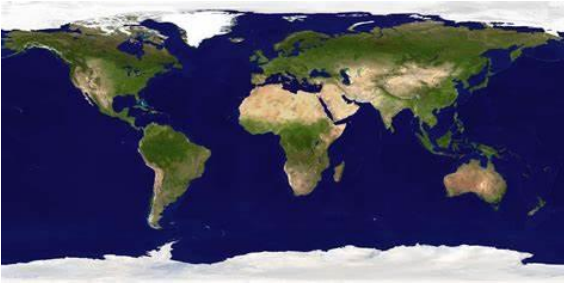


Year 5 Homework grid- Term 3.

Perhaps an Italian Pizza, Polish pierogi, Indonesian Nasi Goreng or Chilean empanadas?



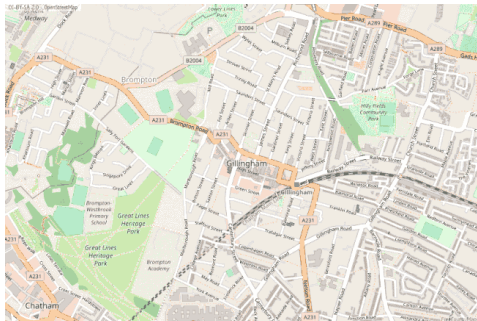
Flag:
