adverb	$\bigvee \bigvee$	I <u>am</u> hungry and I <u>want</u> a snack!	A doing or being word. They show action, state or occurrence.
modal verb	/	Do you want a piece of <u>toast</u> ?	A naming word for a person, place or thing.
conjunction		The dog is under the table waiting for scraps.	A word that tells you when or where something is in relation to something else.
preposition		She looked guiltily at the teacher.	A describing word for a verb.
